Complex Learners Conference

Connecting Parents, Teachers, and Therapists

The Wolf School's first annual Complex



Leaners Conference launched this month on Saturday, November 7. Held in Wolf's Pelson Center, over 70 parents, teachers, occupational therapists, speech pathologists, therapists and other educational professionals attended this half-day event.

Focused on the interplay among anxiety, sensory and language issues for Complex Learners, the conference began with keynote speaker Jennifer Jencks, PhD. Dr. Jencks is Director of the Access Program at Bradley Hospital and a private independent clinician specializing in the treatment of pediatric and adolescent anxiety disorders. Presentations about sensory and language issues were made, respectively, by Lise Gerard Faulise and Rosaline Granoff, both part of the original group of Wolf School founders and current Board members.

These expert speakers were joined by Dr. Gillian Pearis, MD, and Dr. Richard Solomon, PhD for a lively and informative panel discussion.



Based on the positive reception of conference participants, Wolf plans to host additional professional development and educational opportunities for the community.
